

Class Enrolment Confirmation Letter

Thank you for registering for a class through Loyal Learners Pet Services. We are going to have a great time working together!

Please read through this letter and feel free to ask any and all questions that you may have!

What to Bring to Class:

• Your dog on a flat collar, martingale, or slip lead and 6-8 foot leash. No prong collars, electronic collars, or retractable leashes please! If you feel like you need this equipment, please ask me and we can discuss options for you.

- Lots and lots of high value treats. Pea sized is best.
- A clicker if you are using one. This is not a requirement.

• A **treat pouch** is not required, but will make your life a lot easier. They are available for purchase.

- Weather appropriate attire if an outdoor course as classes are rain or shine.
- Poop bags.
- A folding **chair** (if desired).
- A mat for your dog (if desired).
- Water for your dog.

What to Expect:

• Class is intended to be a positive experience for your dog. We will be using a marker (a verbal or a clicker) to tell your dog that he/she performed the desired behavior. This will be in conjunction with your dog's favorite treats to learn and establish behaviors. The food will be his/her paycheck. However, like the clicker, it will NOT be a forever thing.

• When you arrive, select a spot to get your dog settled in. Practice whatever skills your dog knows how to do (sit, shake, eye contact etc) while others arrive.

• Keep dogs out of each others body bubble. I know this is hard to do at times but for safety reasons NO ON LEASH GREETINGS between dogs. Not every dog is social with other dogs and those that are often adversely affected by being on leash during a greeting.

• We will begin class with some warm up exercises as a group. Then we will begin instruction. Instruction will typically start with me explaining WHY we are learning the skill, explaining it, and demonstrating it. Then there will be time to practice. Please note that your dog is NOT the same as your neighbors. I am NOT judging you against each other! I am looking to see that YOUR dog is making progress! At the end of class, we will review skills, answer any questions. Homework is emailed.

Payment and Paperwork:

• Cash (preferred), Money Order Venmo, or PayPal (friends and family option) is welcome. NO CHECKS PLEASE.

• Please bring a signed copy of the "Waiver of Liability Form" to class the first day. This form is found on the last page of this document.

• Bring a copy, email, or text me a photo of your dog's current vaccinations. We require (as age appropriate) a current Rabies and Distemper and highly encourage the Bordetella (Kennel Cough) vaccine.

• Enrollment in a training class will require a deposit which is non-refundable and non transferable to another class. This deposit will be half of the class fee.

Important Information:

Training is part art and a large part science.

My role as your trainer is to coach you to be better able to handle your dog(s). Dogs are not robots. They have feelings, automatic responses to things (such as fear), likes and dislikes, strong and weaker points, and are not always predictable. My goal is to give you the tools so that you can be *PROACTIVE rather than REACTIVE* when working with your dog.

The methods that I use are based on science. Behavior is lawful; all living organisms are bound by the laws of learning. While there are many ways to get a certain behavior, I will teach you the most effective ways to do so in a humane and ethical manner.

The simple version: A – B – C

A=Antecedent (what I am *asking* the dog to, such as "sit") **B=Behavior** (what the dog does, Spot "sits") **C=Consequence** (what happens after the behavior, Spot gets a treat for sitting)

Take away: Dogs are inclined to do what works for to get them the consequence that they desire. Consider this; you go to work for the next 6 weeks and every time your Boss sees you smile, you get a \$10 bill. Great, right? What is the long term effect? We all look like clowns, smiling, a lot, hoping for that reward! Well, that happens with your dog too. If he sits by the door politely and you let him outside, he will be more apt to try this behavior in the future because it ended with the desired consequence. But be careful, it can go the opposite way as well; he begs at the table and gets a scrap, he will be more inclined to do this behavior again, because it worked.

We will work together to ensure that your dog is performing the behaviors that we desire. We do this by asking for appropriate behaviors and paying him/her for it!

Management vs. Training Skills

We do not live in a laboratory. We live in the real world. I will give skills to work with your dog in real life situations. However, managing the environment is a key factor for success, particularly dogs that are managing stress (such as a frightening stimulus). Sometimes, your dog may not have the skills to work in a particular environment and management may be necessary at that time. It is always a work in progress.

Clicker or Marker Word

How does your dog know when they have got it right? *The clicker or a marker word is used to tell your dog when he/she has made the correct choice or performed the desired behavior*.

Criteria for a marker word: One syllable and consistent. "Yes," "Nice," "Right," and "Good" are examples, when said the SAME WAY EVERY TIME. A clicker is also a great option!

Paying your dog

As mentioned, your dog needs to be paid in order to continue to perform the desired behavior. Payment in training is typically a food reward as that is the fastest and most effect way to make a dog feel good. However, eventually we want to use life rewards, games, toys, resources, food, water, walks, car rides, attention, etc. We will work through how and when to do that as we progress.

But I can control my dog easier with a _____ (prong, electronic (vibration or shock) collar, etc).

My goal is to give you skills so that this is not necessary. These tools may be effective, but there are better methods to get your dog to work with you as a team. Plus, dogs are very perceptive and get "collar smart" (only perform with device is on) very easily.

How do I know when my dog KNOWS it?

I find that a lot of people mistake what a dog "knows." Your dog may sit, facing West, at 6am, 99% of the time, but that does not mean that they have the skills to sit, facing North, at 8pm. We need to practice a behavior in many environments and under a variety of distractions before assuming that a dog "knows" something. It generally takes 1,000 reputations to equal understating. It is not fair to punish a dog for skills that he/she does not have.

What if my dog is stubborn? He needs a better motivator.

Concepts to get rid of:

Dogs want to please us! Contrary to what Disney would have us think, dogs, like all mammals, are selfish beings. They want to do what works for them to get the desired outcome. That is not a bad thing, it is the truth.

Dominant Dog/Alpha Theory. Your dog is really not spending his/her every waking moment trying to "dominate" you. I am not saying that some dogs are not more difficult to motivate than some, but it is not a dominance issue.
